We offer courses in **Twɛ, Ga, Fante and Ewe.**

Twɛ

This is a major native language in Ghana mainly spoken by the Akan people, and like Fante is a dialect of the Akan language. Next to English, Twɛ is the most commonly used language of day to day interactions in social and business settings.

Ga

Ga is a member of the Kwa branch of Niger-Congo languages. It is spoken in Ghana by about 600,000 people, particularly in the South East of the country around the capital, Accra.

Fante

Fante (Mfantse) is one of the 3 dialects of the Akan language, and next to Twɛ is the most commonly spoken in Ghana. Fante is spoken in the Central and Western Regions of Ghana.

Ewe

Ewe (Èwè) is another Niger–Congo language, spoken in South Eastern Ghana and Southern Togo by over 3 million people. Ewe is part of a cluster of related languages commonly called Gbe.
